Outpatient Support Services at the Lurie Cancer Center

Emotional and Day-to-Day Support

Lurie Cancer Center social workers, health psychologists and psychiatry professionals help patients cope with challenges that may arise during and after treatment. They offer assistance managing practical concerns related to treatment, such as transportation and finance.
