IV Contrast Dye Allergy Preparation

lodine contrast or dye will be used during your test or procedure. If you have an iodine allergy, you may need to take certain medications before the test. This is important to avoid serious side effects from the dye.

Before the test or procedure

If you have any questions, ask your physician.

At least 24 hours before your test:

• Fill the prescriptions that your physician gave you for the test.

13 hours before your test:

Take 50 milligrams (mg) of prednisone by mouth, as prescribed.

7 hours before your test:

■ Take 50 mg of prednisone by mouth, as prescribed.

1 hour before your test:

- Take 50 mg of prednisone by mouth, as prescribed.
- Take 50 mg of diphenhydramine HCI (Benadryl®) by mouth, as prescribed.

Take these medications with water. If you are not allowed to take food or liquid before your test, take the medications with small sips of water.

If these medications are not taken as directed, your test may not be done.
