Our team of dedicated and reliable therapists will:



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Multidisciplinary approach

Speech therapists use a comprehensive, multidisciplinary approach to diagnose and treat communication and swallowing disorders. Your individualized treatment plan will be based on your specific needs and goals, but could include therapy in the following areas:

Articulation and phonological impairments

Expressive/receptive language delays and disorders

Motor speech disorders such as apraxia and dysarthria

Voice disorders

Cognitive rehabilitation

Head and neck cancer rehabilitation pre- and post-radiation treatment (focused on speech and swallowing)

Swallowing disorders

Videofluoroscopic swallowing evaluations for pediatrics and adults

VitalStim® to stimulate muscle activity necessary for functional swallowing

Pediatric feeding and swallowing disorders

Family education, caretaker education

Vocal cord dysfunction

Post-laryngectomy tracheoesophageal voice restoration

Speech and language rehabilitation for patients with cochlear implants
